RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION (SENIOR & OPEN CLASS)

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

Ingredients - Preferred 100% Australian Grown Produce

250g sultanas

250g chopped raisins

250g currants

125g chopped mixed peel

90g chopped red glace cherries

90g chopped blanched almonds

1/3 cup sherry or brandy

250g plain flour

60g self-raising flour

1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/2 teaspoon ground cloves

250g butter

250g soft brown sugar

1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind

1/2 teaspoon almond essence

1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence

4 large eggs

Here's what you do:

Cut the fruit & almonds into 3-4 pieces and mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add the

fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin **20 cm square, straight sided, square cornered tin** and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

REGULATIONS

An exhibitor having won at a Show, will bake another cake for entry in the Group Final; the winner will then be required to bake a further cake for the State Final at the next Royal Melbourne Show.

An exhibitor having won at Show Level is not eligible to enter any other Show until after the Group judging, when, if not the winning entry, can compete further.

An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Group in the State Final.

An exhibitor having won at Group Level cannot compete further until after the Royal Melbourne Show.

Each cake entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.

If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level then the second placesetter is eligible to compete.

Professionals are not eligible, which is defined as someone that works professionally or derives the greater percentage of their income in that craft, art form or technique.

PRIZES

Winners at Country Shows will each receive a cash prize of \$15.00, and will be required to bake a second "Rich Fruit Cake" in order to compete in the Group Final.

The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria Limited, Group 14 of VAS Ltd, will conduct a Group Final in conjunction with the Royal Melbourne Show, the winner of which will compete in the State Final for the following year. The fourteen winners at Group level will each receive a cash prize of \$20.00, and are required to bake a third "Rich Fruit Cake" for the State Final Judging at the Royal Melbourne Show, for which the prize money will be – 1st \$50, 2nd \$30 and 3rd \$20.

INGREDIENTS

- 375 g plain flour
- 345 g castor sugar
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1½ tsp bicarb soda
- 375 ml vegetable oil
- 4 eggs
- 2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 3 medium carrots, grated (350 g)
- ½ tsp ground nutmeg
- 220g tin crushed pineapple, drained
- ½ tsp allspice
- 180 g pecan nuts coarsely crushed
- 2 tsp salt

STEPS:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C (160°C fan), grease a 23cm (9 inch) round cake tin and line with baking paper.
- 2. Sift they dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well, then add the carrots, crushed, pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
- 3. Bake for approximately 90-100 minutes.
- 4. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rak. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.
