### 2938 RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

(SENIOR & OPEN CLASS)

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

**Here's what you need:**

250g sultanas	1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
250g chopped raisins	1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
250g currants	250g butter
125g chopped mixed peel	250g soft brown sugar
90g chopped red glace cherries	1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR
90g chopped blanched almonds	finely grated lemon rind
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	1/2 teaspoon almond essence
250g plain flour	1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
60g self-raising flour	4 large eggs
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg	

**Here's what you do:**

Mixed together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared **SQUARE** tin with sharp corners, 20cm and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ – 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

**Note:** To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4 or 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 or 4 pieces.

### REGULATIONS

An exhibitor having won at a Show, will bake another cake for entry in the Group Final; the winner will then be required to bake a further cake for the State Final at the next Royal Melbourne Show.

An exhibitor having won at Show Level is not eligible to enter any other Show until after the Group judging, when, if not the winning entry, can compete further.

An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Group in the State Final.

An exhibitor having won at Group Level cannot compete further until after the Royal Melbourne Show.

Each cake entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.

If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level then the second placesetter is eligible to compete.

### PRIZES

Winners at Country Shows will each receive a cash prize of \$15.00, and will be required to bake a second "Rich Fruit Cake" in order to compete in the Group Final.

The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria Limited, Group 14 of VAS Ltd, will conduct a Group Final in conjunction with the Royal Melbourne Show, the winner of which will compete in the State Final for the following year.

The fourteen winners at Group level will each receive a cash prize of \$20.00, and are required to bake a third "Rich Fruit Cake" for the State Final Judging at the Royal Melbourne Show, for which the prize money will be – 1st \$50, 2nd \$30 and 3rd \$20.

**2939 CARROT CAKE COMPETITION**

(OPEN CLASS)

INGREDIENTS:

- 375 g plain flour
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1½ tsp bicarb soda
- 2 tsp ground cinnamon
- ½ tsp ground nutmeg
- ½ tsp allspice
- 2 tsp salt
- 345 g castor sugar
- 375 ml vegetable oil
- 4 eggs
- 3 medium carrots, grated (350 g)
- 200 g tin crushed pineapple, drained
- 200 g pecans, chopped

STEPS:

- Preheat the oven to 180°C (160°C fan), grease a 20cm (8") round cake tin and line with baking paper.
- Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed, pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
- Bake for approximately 90-100 minutes.
- Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.

An exhibitor having won at a Show will bake another cake for entry in the Group Final; the winner will then be required to bake a further cake for the State Final at the next Royal Melbourne Show.
